Preventing Bullying-The Role of the Bystander

Bullying is recognized as a major cause of violence and can
impair the physical and mental health of youth. Most often
the attention falls on the bully and the victim, but research is
now showing that the **bystanders, both adult and youth**,
have the potential to have the most impact on addressing the
situation. Through their intervention they can reduce the
length of the bully episode or prevent it entirely. Bullying
occurs in a variety of settings, including church youth groups,
and we all need to understand how to successfully intervene.
